

To honor the victims and families of the horrific acts of 9/11/01, Lombardi physical education students took part in a stair climb on September 11th. In collaboration with social studies classes, students were given a background on the events of that day, as well as an explanation of how heroic the firefighters, police and many citizens were in attempts to save as many lives as possible. To make the stair climb more meaningful, students learned that the World Trade Center's Twin Towers each consisted of 110 floors and approximately 2000 steps and that 2000 stair steps

equals approximately 1 mile. Students then went outside and tried to climb as many stairs as possible within their class period.
